Re: Records Access Request

We are replying to your request for information that was received on October 9, 2025. In that request, you sought access to VPD file numbers 22-144822, 22-147473, and 22-142374.

Enclosed please find a copy of VPD file numbers 22-144822 and 22-147473. No formal report was written for file number 22-144822, so the Computer Aided Dispatch (CAD) report has been provided, as this is the only available information. Information that could unreasonably invade the privacy of other persons has been removed from the records. Particular emphasis in this case has been placed on sections 15(1)(l), 16(1)(b) and 22(3)(b) of the *Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act* ("the Act"). Excerpts of these provisions are attached.

With regard to your request for VPD file 22-142374, the Act requires a public body to refuse to disclose information, where such disclosure would be considered an unreasonable invasion of third party privacy. We have reviewed the responsive records and note that it does not contain any of your personal information (name, etc.) We have relied on sections 22(1) and 22(3)(b) of the Act, in making our determination that we must refuse to provide access to this police file in its entirety as it does not involve you, and is purely the personal information of third parties.

Under s. 52 of the Act, you may ask the Office of the Information and Privacy Commissioner to review our response to your request. You have thirty (30) days from the receipt of this letter to request a review by writing to:

Disclosure harmful to law enforcement

- 15 (1) The head of a public body may refuse to disclose information to an applicant if the disclosure could reasonably be expected to ...(I) harm the security of any property or system, including a building, a vehicle, a computer system or a communications system.

Disclosure harmful to intergovernmental relations or negotiations

- 16 (1) The head of a public body may refuse to disclose information to an applicant if the disclosure could reasonably be expected to...(b) reveal information received in confidence from a government, council or organization listed in paragraph (a) or their agencies

Disclosure harmful to personal privacy

- 22 (3) A disclosure of personal information is presumed to be an unreasonable invasion of a third party's personal privacy if...(b) the personal information was compiled and is identifiable as part of an investigation into a possible violation of law, except to the extent that disclosure is necessary to prosecute the violation or to continue the investigation.
